# Ask for Help Emergency call criteria

You are not alone. Expert advice is only a phone call away.



If a patient in the Emergency Department meets any of the emergency call criteria, the hospital medical officer must speak to the senior doctor on call.

General practitioners who work in the emergency department do not have to speak to another senior doctor, but we encourage them to do so. A second opinion can often be helpful.

## **Emergency call** criteria

### Airway

Threatened

### **Breathing**

Respiratory Rate <10

Respiratory Rate >28

O2 sat < 90 % on oxygen

#### Circulation

Pulse Rate <50

Pulse Rate >120

Systolic BP < 90

### Neurology

GCS < 14

Seizures

#### Other

Children < 12 months old

Multi-trauma

You are unsure what to do, or worried about any patient

#### IMPROVING SAFETY IN RURAL EMERGENCY DEPARTMENTS

Even small emergency departments are expected to deal, at short notice, with critically ill patients. Sometimes these patients would challenge the well staffed teams of specialists in a large city emergency department.

Unfortunately, small rural hospitals cannot have senior staff in the Emergency department at all times. Hospital medical officers will often be alone - and feel very alone.

The emergency call criteria offers you the chance to call for help. And, to stop you worrying about whether you will get in trouble for calling in the middle of the night, we have taken the

choice away. You **must** call for help as soon as any of these criteria are met.

For immediate hands on help, if needed, consider asking for help from any senior doctor currently in the hospital.
